Day 1 April 5th: Heading to Ireland!

This evening you board your flight for an overnight transatlantic journey to Ireland.

Day 2 April 6th: - 'Céad Míle Fáilte' - A Hundred Thousand Welcomes

This morning we arrive in Dublin Airport, grab our baggage and head out to the arrivals area where we meet our friendly Irish tour guide who will spend the next 8 days with us. We then depart on our journey to the town of *Athlone* where we spend our first night on the island. On route we make a stop at *Trim Castle*. The castle is the largest Anglo-Norman fortification in Ireland. Hugh de Lacy and his





successors took 30 years to build it.

The castle is often called King John's Castle although when he visited the town he preferred to stay in his tent on the other side of the river. Richard II visited Trim in 1399 and left Prince Hal, later Henry V, as a prisoner in the castle. We continue our journey to Athlone, making a brief stop for lunch before we check into our hotel, drop off our baggage. That afternoon we are free to explore this beautiful medieval town at your own discretion! There is

much to see here, including many castles and churches dating back as far as 1897. We gather later that night for a group welcome dinner, at our hotel.

After a special day in Father Louis' home place, we continue our journey south to Ennis where we check into our hotel, spend some time relaxing in our scenic surroundings. Day 4 April 8th: Day Trip to Cliffs of Moher



This morning after breakfast, we head off on our day trip, to the rugged coastline of County Clare where we visit the mighty *Cliffs of Moher*. The Cliffs are over 700 feet high at the highest point and range for over 5 miles over the Atlantic Ocean. O'Brien's Tower stands proudly on a headland of the majestic Cliffs. On a clear day we can see the Aran Islands, Galway Bay, as well as The Twelve Pins, the Maum Turk Mountains in Connemara and Loop Head, to the South. We return to our hotel to relax. Later this evening, we turn back time with dinner and entertainment at a medieval banquet at Bunratty Castle.

Day 5 April 9th: Ennis – Adare – Killarney

Day 6 April 10th: Jaunting Cars and Day Trip to Muckross Traditional Farms

This morning after breakfast we head off on our day through the *Kilarney National Park on the Ring of Kerry* - a trip to *Muckross Gardens and Traditional Farms*. We are greeted this morning by the traditional *Jaunting Cars* to take us to our next destination in Muckross. We are in for a very fun hands-on experience at *Muckross Traditional Farms*. Upon arrival we get a private guided tour of the working farm where we are immersed in farm life such as baking soda bread on the open fire using a griddle, hand-milking the cows, watch the blacksmith work the forge and much more. We arrive at *Quills Farmhouse* for a butter making



demonstration and tasting. Next, we head to Muckross Schoolhouse to learn a few words of Gaelic (Irish language). Now that we have worked the farm and learned to speak Irish, we enjoy a delicious lunch while being entertained with traditional Irish music. This afternoon and evening you are free to relax. Enjoy the hotel or spend some time in the town, experience the many great restaurants and enjoy a music session in one of the many pubs. You can't go wrong in this lively town there is something for everyone.

Overnight: Killarney – The Lake Hotel(B, L)





After breakfast we bid farewell to Killarney and head east across the southern part of Ireland to Ireland's Medieval City Kilkenny. Home to the 12th century Kilkenny Castle, 18th century St. Marys Cathedral and the Medieval Mile, a trail running through the city where you can explore the history and heritage of this historic place. After check-in you will have some free time to enjoy wandering the narrow walks that open up to the New Canal Square. Pass time watching the River Nore peak out from beneath Green's Bridge and John's

Bridge. Art galleries, historic buildings, craft and design workshops, theatre, comedy, public gardens and museums all await you in this enchanting city. Enjoy the vibrant music scene—deeply rooted in traditional Irish Music—and fantastic cuisine, all live the Irish life in Kilkenny. We will then enjoy dinner together at our hotel .

Day 8 April 12th: Killkenny – National Stud and Gardens – Dublin

After a hearty breakfast in our hotel today, we depart Killkenny and continue our journey to Dublin with a stop in Kildare to visit the very famous *Irish National Stud* and Gardens. A visit to the foaling unit is highly recommended at this time of year where we might be lucky enough to see the first steps of a future champion as the best time to see a foal being born is between February and April. We can also get up close to the spectacular stallions at the paddock, spot lively yearlings or watch the protective mares with their frolicking foals. Even if you're not a



racing aficionado, you'll be able to appreciate the historical success that has built this place and the passion that has sustained it. We also experience the beautiful *Japanese Gardens designed by craftsman Tassa Eida*. These gardens combine art, philosophy and nature in perfect balance to create a tranquil and contemplative environment. Upon arrival in Dublin, we check into our hotel, and we are free to enjoy this evening as we wish. There are lots of great local options for dinner on own tonight.

Day 9 April 13th: Exploring Dublin's Fair City

This morning you are free to partake in a *panoramic tour of Dublin City* after breakfast at the hotel. In the early afternoon, we will take a tour of the *EPIC museum* where we learn that over the centuries more than 10 million people emigrated from Ireland – at the EPIC museum we can find out why they left, where they went and how they shaped the world. The museum was founded on the belief that emigration is one of the most interesting ways to fully understand a country. As we uncover the stories of our emigrants, we'll realize that emigration is not



about what people leave behind, but what they bring with them. We may even be able to trace our ancestry here! To celebrate our last night on the island, we will enjoy an *Irish Cabaret Experience with some traditional Irish music and food* to give us the perfect send off!
